Four HSC DesignTECH Nominations

With a record of excellence in Design and Technology textiles, Roseville College has secured four nominations for the 2009 DesignTECH exhibition in outstanding fashion design and construction.

Year 12 graduates Naomi Young, Ellen Molesworth, Emma Greenland and Michaela Upton created textile-based Major Works for their Design & Technology HSC project and have been shortlisted for the Board of Studies' premier exhibition DesignTECH.

Design & Technology teacher, Ms Robyn Collins, says she is excited and thrilled for each of the girls who received a nomination, and applauded their classmates who demonstrated strong teamwork and support for each other.

"I sought to foster a culture of creativity and collaboration in the studio for students to generate ideas, work out solutions and encourage one another," explains Ms Collins. "These nominations are not only a compliment to the four students; but to the whole class."

"I loved teaching these students, who were inspirational and motivated, eager to learn and innovate, and willing to accept suggestions to strengthen their work," she adds.

Up to a third of the 2009 class have applied to design courses, with the majority of 2009 Major Works in textiles. Other mediums include wood, furnishings and graphics. In 2008, Alexandra Comino was named the 2008 Singer Young Designer, in which two College graduates were finalists.
