Ninety-three Roseville girls from the Class of 2002 and their teachers are to be congratulated on the outstanding HSC results which placed **Roseville College 21st in the State** in the merit list of top schools.

- 4% attained a **UAI of over 99**.
  - 12% attained a **UAI of over 98**.
  - 24% attained a **UAI of over 95**.
  - 46% attained a **UAI of over 90**.
  - 62% attained a **UAI of over 85**.
  - 71% attained a **UAI of over 80**.
- Roseville girls achieved **132 mentions** in the Board of Studies Distinguished Achievers' List of students who were placed in the highest Band, Band 6, representing a mark of **over 90** in individual subjects.
  - **46** Roseville girls achieved Band 5 or 6 in at least 10 units.
  - **86%** of Year 12 applicants received first-round offers, securing them a place in a University course of their choice.

Although Roseville is not an academically selective school, our girls have obtained remarkable success across a wide range of courses.

### PREMIER'S AWARD

Six Roseville girls achieved Band 6, representing a mark of 90 or above in at least 10 units: **Megan Borda, Charlotte Kwik, Linda Lin, Jacqueline Martin, Lauren Pilz and Clare Powell**. To acknowledge these exceptional achievements, each girl received a prestigious **Premier's Award for All-round Excellence in the HSC**.

Roseville has a reputation for producing articulate and confident well-rounded young women. We have a broad based curriculum which affirms our commitment to academic rigour, with a strong emphasis on achieving academic excellence. 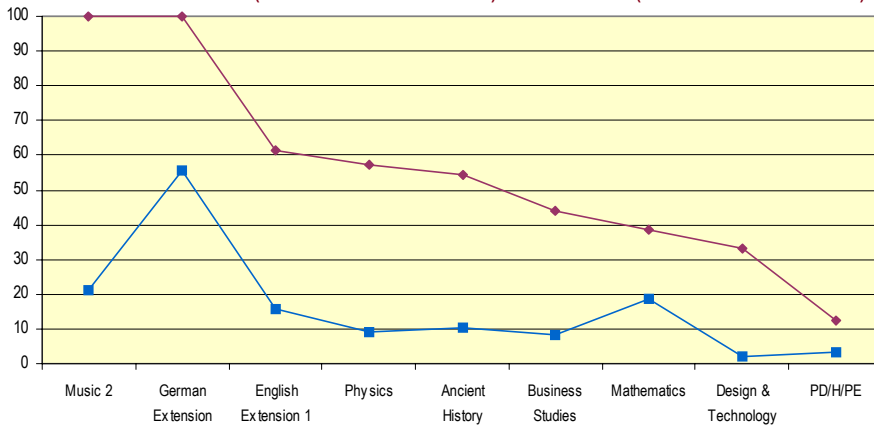

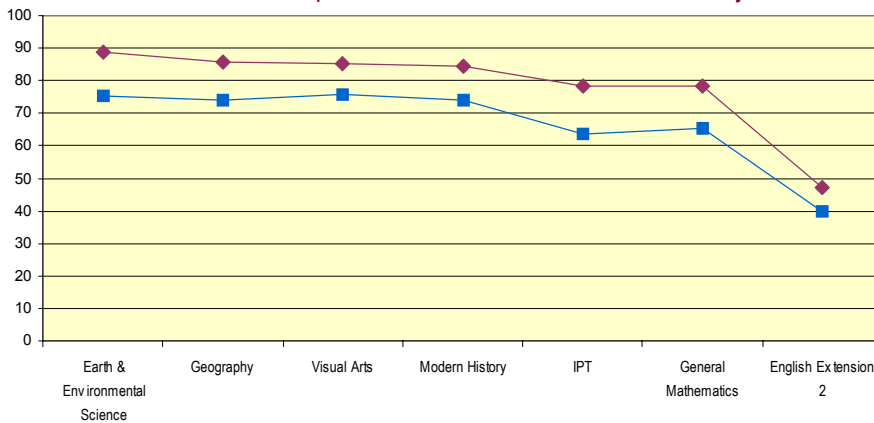
Percentage of Roseville students compared with the State percentage who achieved Band 6 (90 or more out of 100) or Band E4 (45 or more out of 50)
